# Spa-Classic draws huge crowds

With a record 339 cars in action at the 2019 Spa-Classic, there was much for the event's biggest-ever crowd to enjoy from 17-19 May.

Lolas took both Classic Endurance Racing victories, courtesy of David Hart's T70 Mk3B and Philippe Scemama's T600, while Mike Wrigley pedalled his Spice SE89C to double Group C success.

Come the finish of the first

Heritage Touring Cup contest, the top eight places were filled by BMWs, led by Michael Erlich in his 3.0 CSL. The same model was on top in race two, this time with Christian Traber taking the spoils from Maxime Guenat's Capri.

After two hours of racing, 27 secs was the margin of victory between the Cobras of Thierry de Latre du Bosqueau/Christophe Van Riet

from Charles Firmenich/Henri Moser in Sixties' Endurance.

It was far closer in 'The Greatest's Trophy' races: while Afschin Fatemi (Porsche 904 GTS) won both, the first was by just 0.094 secs.

Andrew Kirkaldy took top honours in the 911-only 2.0L Cup and James Cottingham won both Endurance Racing Legends races in a Dallara SP1 prototype.



## Zandvoort's variety show

It was sunshine and showers at the seaside for the 43rd Historic Zandvoort Trophy on 11-12 May.

On a drying track for the Dutch pre-'66 championship, Hans Hugenholtz in an AC Cobra made a flying start, chased by Jonathan Lewis in his Mini Cooper 'S'. The



Cobra's power advantage soon told and took the win. In race two, a broken engine sidelined Hugenholtz and Bob Stevens (Lotus Elan) beat Malte Müller-Wrede (Marcos 1800 GT). The latter scored a Legendary Circuits hat-trick.

In the GT & Touring Cars championship, Hans de Graaf (Porsche 911) took two victories, with Swedish rallycross legend Rolf Myggan Nilsson (Ford Escort R\$2000) claiming the third. Pieter Bikker secured a Dutch '82-'90 triple in a Group A BMW 325i, while Dan Clowes' Jedi dominated the Monoposto UK contests.

### HILLCLIMB RECORDS TUMBLE

The Vintage Sports-Car Club's 2019 Speed Championship kicked off in fine style at Curborough on Good Friday (19 April), as records tumbled in the sun. Three class records fell, including James Baxter's Class 15 general record of 35.21 secs in his 1934/'35 Riley-ERA, which was enough to establish a new course record en route to first overall.

The weather was again glorious for round two at the Wiscombe Park Hill Climb on 12 May, where Fastest Time of the Day was achieved by Ian Baxter in his 1937Alta 61 IS, with 47.54 secs.



Baxter (ERA) set a new Curborough best
